

The Life Stages course ended [last Friday, 9/27/2024], and the students are currently taking their exams as I write this. I heard lovely, spontaneous feedback about the course overall, how much it was enjoyed by so many in the class (including some future geriatricians!!!), and kudos for individual facilitators as well. The training in geriatrics the students received these past 2 weeks could never have happened without the entire division's generous giving of their time and expertise. By numbers, I count:

13 geri faculty who taught large group sessions - panels, home visit demonstration, lectures, 38 geri faculty who taught in small group sessions (including community geriatricians! and T32 fellows),

<u>15 geri faculty who have contributed to curriculum development</u> (including the previous course directors who deserve special thanks for fighting to develop and maintain this curriculum despite expanding competing curricular demands),
