

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Table 1. Specification and Emulation of a Target Trial Evaluating Initiation of Antihypertensive Medication and Risk of Severe Falls

Protocol component	Target trial specification	Target trial emulation using VA data
Eligibility criteria	1 Age ≥65 y between 2006 and 2019 2 Residence in a long-term care nursing home in the VA 3 Receiving a stable antihypertensive therapy regimen 4 No evidence of end-stage kidney disease	Criteria 1, 2, and 4 were the same as the target trial. For criterion 3, patients were required to have a stable antihypertensive medication regimen for 4 wk and not have used the initiated therapy in the 28-d washout period prior to initiation.
Treatment strategies	Exposure arm: addition of antihypertensive class to existing regimen; control arm: continuation of existing regimen	Treatment strategies were the same as the target trial. Medication use was ascertained using BCMA data.
Treatment assignment	Individuals were randomly assigned to 1 of the 2 treatment strategies; neither the patient nor prescriber was blinded to the intervention	Patients were evaluated weekly for eligibility and were classified into 1 of 2 treatment strategies. Randomization was emulated by adjusting for imbalances in >50 baseline covariates using a 1:4 propensity score-matching approach. Neither the patient nor prescriber was blinded to the intervention.
Follow-up	Starts on the day after the eligibility criteria are fulfilled and ends on the 30th day	Same as the target trial
Outcomes	Fracture	Same as the target trial
Causal contrasts	Per-protocol effect	Same as the target trial
Statistical analysis	IR of fractures per 100 person-years; HR for fractures using control arm as the referent category	Adjusted IRs and relative risks were estimated via 1:4 propensity score matching
