




















Congratulations to the following <u>SPOT Award</u> recipients who were nominated by their supervisors and/or colleagues!



Health information online can sometimes come from unreliable sources and be false and misleading, leading to harmful health effects.

Unreliable sources of online health information may include

- · Personal or business social media accounts
- Companies selling dietary supplements, "natural" cures, or weight loss programs
- Artificial intelligence "bots" posing as medical experts

Trusted sources of online health information from medical experts include

- Government websites ending in .gov (eg, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention [CDC], National Institutes of Health [NIH])
- Medical university websites ending in .edu (eg, Harvard Medical School, Johns Hopkins University)
- Social media accounts from medical journals and health care systems (eg, JAMA Network, Mayo Clinic)



Talk to your doctor if you are unsure whether the medical advice you read online is accurate and safe.
