The conference brought together primary care and legal services professionals to learn ways to collaborate and address older adults' medical legal needs, especially those on Medi-Cal in our California communities. Led by Sarah Hooper, JD, Dementia Care Aware's Medical-Legal Practice Network has developed <u>resources</u> for primary care teams to tackle the medical-legal needs they encounter. Todd James, MD and the Dementia Care Aware San Francisco Health Network team also attended the conference.



Eric Widera, MD published an editorial in JAGS describing how a workgroup dominated by industry wants to redefine Alzheimer's as an abnormal accumulation of amyloid, regardless of current or future cognitive function. Dr. Widera raises a rarely asked question based on this new definition: "Who gets to decide how to redefine a disease? ".

Eric Widera, MD was also quoted in an article "Inside the plan to diagnose Alzheimer's in people with no memory problems — and who stands to benefit" published in the LA Times.


