





UCSF Center for Geriatric Care (UCGC) provides personalized, expert care tailored to the unique needs of older adults by a specialized team of geriatric physicians, nurses, and social workers. Patients have access to onsite psychiatry, psychology, and phlebotomy services with physical therapy and imaging services nearby. In order to receive primary care at UCGC, a patient must be age 75 or older living in San Francisco or age 65 to 74 living in San Francisco with dementia. A patient can receive consultative visits to support ongoing care if they have a primary care provider at UCSF already. To get started, you can schedule your appointment here.
