Mitchel Erickson et al. published a recent article in the Journal of Alzheimer's Disease Reports.

This investigation researched the benefits of a healthcare team-guided approach to successful attendance at a formal evaluation at the UCSF Memory and Aging Center (MAC) versus the standard of care driven by the patient/caregiver dyad with their primary care provider guiding the referral. The direct referral benefits of the Age Friendly Emergency Department NPs to the MAC for patients with an identified risk of cognitive impairment in coordination with the MAC greatly improved the success of attending an appointment and reducing equity access barriers for all patients receiving a timely evaluation when the benefits of novel therapies have their greatest benefit.

Follow filmmaker Kate Schermerhorn through her family's process and emotions as her aging parents downsized into assisted living and dealt with illness.


View an early screening of the film, listen to a panel discussion on the issues it raises, and join us for a reception to meet the filmmaker.
