

Todd James, MD has been invited to join and has accepted a position on the Editorial Board of the Journal of Geriatric Emergency Medicine (JGEM). This peer-reviewed journal, which launched in January 2020, aims to prepare America's professional workforce to deliver excellent emergency care for acutely ill and injured older adults. This initiative is partially sponsored by Advocate Health Wisconsin and the Geriatric Emergency Department Collaborative. Key philanthropic supporters include the John A. Hartford Foundation, West Health Foundation, and Stanley Kritzik.









Kara Bischoff, MD, Division of Palliative Medicine, along with Division of Geriatrics members Kanan Patel, MPH, MBBS, John Boscardin, PhD, and Alex Smith, MD, MPH, MS published a modern validation of the Palliative Performance Scale (PPS) in JAMA Network Open. The PPS is the most widely used prognostic index on ePrognosis. It's also the most inaccurate, likely because it was developed when palliative care consults were for patients on the brink of death. Kara evaluated PPS in a modern validation cohort and updated ePrognosis.


