The Stupski Foundation has awarded the UCSF PREPARE





As we approach the Fall season, we're sharing Division Staff <u>Paula Sison's</u> <u>Garlic Butter Shrimp Recipe!</u>

Garlic Butter Shrimp by Paula Sison

Prep time: 10 min Cook time: 22 min

Ingredients

- 2 lbs shrimp cleaned
- 2 tablespoons parsley chopped
- 1/4 cup butter 1 head garlic crushed
- 1 cup lemon-lime soda 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- salt and pepper to taste



- 1. Marinate the shrimp in lemon soda for about 10 minutes
- Melt the butter in a pan,
- 3. Add the garlic, Cook in low heat until the color turns light brown
 4. Put in the shrimp, Adjust heat to high, Stir-fry until the
- shrimp turns orange.

 5. Season with ground black pepper, salt, and lemon juice. Stir.
- 6. Add parsley. Cook for 30 seconds.7. Serve hot. Enjoy!
