Carla Perissinotto, MD, MHS is an Associate Professor in the Division of Geriatrics at the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF) School of Medicine. She is dedicated to working in both community and academic settings. Dr. Perissinotto has gained national and international recognition for her research on the effects of loneliness on the health of older adults. She is frequently invited to discuss her research and discuss the clinical and policy implications of the health effects of loneliness.

Janet Myers, PhD, MPH is a medical sociologist whose research focuses on evaluation of HIV care and treatment interventions delivered in clinical settings. Her work also focuses on implementation research in correctional settings including jails, prisons and detention centers. Dr. Myers also teaches program evaluation in the UCSF implementation science certificate program.

Ashwin Kotwal, MD, MS is an Assistant Professor of Medicine in the Division of Geriatrics at the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF) School of Medicine. His research interests involve evaluation of community-based interventions to address loneliness and isolation, particularly among older adults with cognitive impairment or approaching the end of life.
